

The Agnes Scott College Permanent Collection is a vibrant, eclectic gathering of artworks that encompass a broad range of media and styles. The greater part of the collection is on display throughout the campus, available for the exploration and enjoyment of the community. At its foundation are the Harry L. Dalton and Clifford M. Clarke Collections. Over time the roster of works has expanded significantly, included recent gifts of the J. Jefferson Jones III and Lou Pate Jones '37 Collection, the Margaret R. Law '25 Collection and American Art Pottery from the Dr. Jimmy Harris Collection. The focus of new acquisitions is predominately but not exclusively works on paper by women artists. The latest additions include artists Barbara Kruger, Sally Mann, Annette Cone-Skelton and Robin Perry Dana '97. The collection is managed under the direction of the Art Advisory Committee. Having such works of art on view for investigation and inspiration enriches the campus environment, engaging the viewer in a dialogue that is always pertinent and timeless.
