# GENERAL INFORMATION

Agnes Scott College is a private, four-year liberal arts college founded in 1889 by members of Decatur Presbyterian Church. The institution was named for the mother of Col. George Washington Scott, a prominent Presbyterian industrialist and developer. His gifts of land, the first college building, furnishings, and equipment was the largest gift to the cause of education ever made in Georgia up to that time.

Agnes Scott College's tradition of academic excellence continues today with a student body that represents the top women students in the nation. Students come from 25 states and 10 countries. With 92% of the faculty holding doctorates and a student-faculty ratio of 7 to 1, the College offers opportunities for interaction and involvement that few colleges can match.

The campus, noted for its handsome Gothic and Victorian buildings, winding brick walks, towering trees, and wide expanses of lawn, occupies more than 100 acres. With newly refurbished residence halls, fine arts buildings, and a campus life center, as well as the addition of a new physical activities building and state-of-the-art athletic field, over \$21 million in renovations are complete.
