Faculty

Agnes Scott's faculty of 80 women and men (85% of whom hold the earned doctorate) is enriched by visiting faculty members from other institutions in the U.S. and abroad. A student faculty ratio of 8:1 permits small classes and individual attention. Every student is assigned a faculty advisor to assist in course selection and academic counseling.

Costs

Tuition for 1984-85 is \$6500. Residence costs, including room, board, and infirmary service, total \$2700. The student activity fee is \$90. Personal expenses, including books and supplies, are estimated at \$800 per year.

Financial Aid and Scholarships

No qualified student with financial need should hesitate to apply to Agnes Scott. The College attempts to meet 100% of demonstrated need as indicated by the Financial Aid Form of the College Scholarship Service.


An Agnes Scott financial aid award is a combination of grant, low-interest loan, and the opportunity for campus employment. Grants and student loan funds are applied toward students' accounts. No interest payment is required on student loans while the student attends ASC. Agnes Scott offers many special scholarships based on merit, leadership and talent.

Chartered by Phi Beta Kappa in 1926. The campus, located 5 miles from downtown Atlanta, is set on 100 beautifully wooded acres and is 3 blocks from the public rapid-rail transit system.

1984 Admissions Profile: 76% of applicants were accepted. 46% of these enrolled. Freshmen profile: 85% ranked in top 25% of high school class, 56% in top 10%, and 99% in top 1/2; average SAT, 536 verbal, 556 math, 1092 composite; average ACT, 26 composite. Required: SAT or ACT (SAT preferred).

Recommended: 3 Achievement Tests including English Composition, Math Level 1, and any third. Campus interview recommended.

Student Body

The College seeks a diverse, national student body. Transfers and international students are welcome. The College admits qualified students without regard to race, creed, national or ethnic origin, or physical handicap.

Academic Program

The College operates under an academic calendar of three quarters. The curriculum is designed to help students gain basic knowledge in the humanities, natural sciences and mathematics, and social and behaviorial sciences and to achieve competence in one of two disciplines. Single, double, and individually designed majors give students flexibility in planning their area of academic concentration.

For students interested in business careers, the College has selected from its curriculum a group of courses designed to familiarize them with the skills and knowledge to facilitate their entrance into business. The program does not alter requirements for graduation, nor does it constitute a major. Rather, it is designed to serve as an academic bridge from an undergraduate liberal arts curriculum into business careers.

The Agnes Scott curriculum provides preparation for graduate study or entrance into such professional schools as architecture, law, medicine, dentistry, business, journalism, social service and education.

Agnes Scott has a state-approved program at the elementary and middle school levels, in several secondary fields, certification in elementary/general music and/or choral music. Satisfactory completion enables initial Georgia certification, generallly accepted throughout the U.S.

The Return to College Program offers women beyond the traditional college age the opportunity to attend the College for a degree or for personal enrichment on a schedule that meets their individual needs. **Special Programs**

Independent study, junior year abroad, Washington Semester, Georgia Legislative Internships, internships in individualized majors, exchange program with Mills College in California. Miscellaneous: Air Force and Navy ROTC.

Agnes Scott offers a dual degree program with Georgia Tech in which a student may combine three years at ASC with two years at Georgia Tech and receive degrees from both schools. Qualified students may enter any one of 9 fields of engineering, industrial management, information and computer science, or management science.

Student Government

Agnes Scott is a self-governing community, and each student is a member of the Student Government Association (SGA). The Honor System is the cornerstone of life at Agnes Scott. The freedom to grow responsibility in social and academic life is the basis on which the Honor System is built. Each member of the college community is committed to develop and uphold high standards of honesty and behavior. Self-scheduled exams, unproctored quizzes, and open rooms are among the benefits enjoyed by students.

Athletic Programs

Women (NAIA Div. III):

Intercollegiate tennis and cross country. Indoor swimming pool, gymnasium for volleyball, basketball, and dance; athletic fields for archery, hockey, softball, and soccer.

Social Activities

Street dances, TGIF, and fraternity parties with Georgia Tech, Emory University, Atlanta University and other neighboring colleges. Football games, theatre productions, art openings, concerts, lectures and college traditions such as Black Cat, Senior Investiture, and Sophomore Parents' Weekend.
