2010 ASC Senior Survey Report

The senior survey was administered online in the Spring of 2010 with invitations issued by email; the survey opened two and a half weeks before commencement and students could respond until the day before commencement. Overall, 161 out of 173 graduates participated in the 2010 Senior Survey. This represents a response rate of 93% for the Class of 2010.
