2011 ASC Senior Survey Report

The senior survey was administered online in the Spring of 2011 with invitations issued by email; the survey opened two and a half weeks before commencement and students could respond until the day before commencement. Overall, 183 out of 193 graduates participated in the 2011 Senior Survey. This represents a response rate of 95% for the Class of 2011.

1. Primary activity for Fall 2011*

Employment (FT or PT) = 79 (43%)

Graduate/Professional School (FT or PT) = 44 (24%)

Year Five = 12 (7%)

Additional undergraduate course work (not Year 5) = 1 (1%)

Other (volunteering, raising a family, traveling, other) = 16 (9%)

Military Service = 3 (2%)

Undecided = 28 (15%)
