2012 ASC Senior Survey Report

The senior survey was administered online in the Spring of 2012 with invitations issued by email; the survey opened two and a half weeks before commencement and students could respond until two days before commencement. Overall, 155 out of 166 graduates participated in the 2012 Senior Survey. This represents a response rate of 93% for the Class of 2012.
