2013 ASC Senior Survey Report

The senior survey was administered online in the Spring of 2013 with invitations issued by email; the survey opened two and a half weeks before commencement and students could respond until three days before commencement. Overall, 158 out of 175 graduates participated in the 2013 Senior Survey. This represents a response rate of 90% for the Class of 2013.
