

Dr. Mead is associate curator of ethnology at the American Museum of Natural History and adjunct professor of anthropology at Columbia University. She is perhaps best known for her research in primitive societies of the South Seas. Among her most recent publications are New Lives for Old and An Anthropologist at Work.

CHARLES P. TAFT

This son of the 27th President of the United States was rated at one time by *Fortune* as mayor of the best governed city in the country. He is a leading tax and trial lawyer, labor consultant, housing expert, and churchman.

ALICE JERNIGAN DOWLING

A 1930 graduate of Agnes Scott, Mrs. Dowling has served with her husband, Walter C. Dowling, in diplomatic posts in Oslo, Lisbon, Rome, Rio, Vienna, Seoul, and Bonn. She has been especially active in work with handicapped children, and she received an award from the Korean government for her service in a children's hospital and the Korean war widows organization. The Dowlings now live in Paris.





MARK VAN DOREN

Since retiring from Columbia University in 1959, Dr. Van Doren has spent his time in lecturing and writing. He was visiting professor of English at Harvard for the spring term of 1963. His Collected Poems won for him a Pulitzer Prize in 1940. In addition to his poetry, Dr. Van Doren has written drama, fiction, and non-fiction.

SIR CHARLES SNOW

C. P. Snow as a British scientist and novelist has been a strong advocate of bridging the gap between "the two cultures," pure science and the humanities. His best known works of fiction are *The Masters* and *The Affair*, the latter having appeared as a play on Broadway.

GEORGE M. DOCHERTY

Dr. Docherty, a native of Scotland, is minister of the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church, Washington, D. C.

LeROY P. COLLINS

Governor of Florida from 1955 to 1960, Mr. Collins is now serving as president of the National Association of Broadcasters.
