Do you know someone or have you heard of someone in your community whose house has been burglarized lately? It is likely that you have. There is no community that is exempt from this terrible crime. Burglaries of residences are an increasing problem in our community. In 1974 there were 298 burglaries committed in Decatur; in 1975 there were 469 burglaries committed in Decatur, and, for the first seven months in 1976, there were 215 burglaries committed in our city. Most of these burglaries were committed not by professional criminals, but rather, by casual criminals who took advantage of an opportunity created by carelessness, oversight, or just not knowing what to do on the part of the resident. While there is no simple, sure solution to the problem of home burglaries, it is possible to make the burglar's task more difficult, and in some cases, to discourage him altogether.
