Focus on Faith Week will be from January 23 to 26. The speaker this year will be the Rev. J. Randolph Taylor, pastor of the Myers Park Presbyterian Church in Charlotte, North Carolina, and formerly minister of the Central Presbyterian Church, Atlanta. While in Atlanta, he served as chairman of the following groups: (1) The Atlanta Community Relations Commission, (2) Literacy Action, Inc., and (3) the Metropolitan Atlanta Housing Conference. Dr. Taylor is presently chairman of the joint committee on Presbyterian Union and is a trustee of the Interdenominational Theological Center in Atlanta, of St. Andrews Presbyterian College, and of Johnson C. Smith Seminary. He is a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Davidson College, received his theological training at Union Theological Seminary in Virginia, and earned his doctorate at the University of Aberdeen in Scotland.

While Ms. Crichton is here, she will be asked to give her impressions of the inauguration.
