Summer Biology Program

The Biology Department is offering Biology 315 SUS (Marine Biology) during the summer of 1981. This four-week course is scheduled from June 8 to July 5, 1981 and examines the biology of marine organisms and environments at selected sites on the coasts of Georgia and Florida.
