Dr. Mary L. Boney, associate professor of Bible at Agnes Scott College, has been appointed recently to a special committee to draw up a new brief statement of faith for the Presbyterian Church in the United States. Dr. Boney is the only woman on this twelve member committee, made up of personnel from eight states.

Dr. Boney, who joined the Agnes Scott faculty in 1949, is a native of Wilmington, N.C. She is a graduate of the Woman's College of the University of North Carolina. She received the M.A. degree from Emory University and the Ph.D. degree from Columbia University. Before joining the Agnes Scott faculty, she was director of religious education for Druid Hills Presbyterian Church of Atlanta.
