Awards for summer study have been made to six members of the Agnes Scott College faculty through a grant from the Danforth Foundation, Dean C. Benton Kline has announced.

Miss Frances Benbow Clark, assistant professor of French, will complete work toward the Ph.D. degree from Yale University. Dr. Paul L. Garber, professor of Bible, will study in the Christian Art Index at Princeton University. Miss Roxie Hagopian, director of the College's glee club, will study Russian during the summer months.

Robert Westervelt, assistant professor of art, will work in New York and Boston museums. Miss Kay Manual will be at New York University in the Physical Education department, and Raymond Martin, college organist, will work toward the Doctorate of Sacred Music at Union Seminary in New York.

Agnes Scott is one of 36 colleges receiving summer study grants on a Danforth Foundation program to increase faculty competence and academic excellence in colleges of liberal arts and sciences.
