Dr. Florene Johnson Dunstan, Atlanta's 1963 Woman of the Year in Education, has recently been elected president of the Georgia chapter of the American Association of Teachers of Spanish and Portuguese for the 1966-67 term.

Mrs. Dunstan, Chairman of the Department of Spanish at Agnes Scott College, is well-known in the Atlanta community for her distinguished service in the field of education. Under her leadership, the local chapter of the American Association of University Women conducted a highly successful conference on the school dropout problem in our area. Now, Dr. Dunstan is serving as the Area Representative for World Problems for the Georgia Division of the AAUW. She has also been appointed by Congressman James Mackay to serve as the chairman for the Latin American section on the Panel on International Affairs.

Over the years, Dr. Dunstan has taken an active role in stimulating public interest in foreign cultures by speaking to local groups and planning educational programs that promote wider knowledge of other countries. The Dunstans have opened their home to foreign students on numerous occasions, and since 1952, have provided "a home away from home" for nineteen foreign students.

As the new state head of AATSP, Dr. Florene Dunstan will travel to Chicago to represent Georgia at the association's annual meeting to be held on December 29 and 30.
